Principle 5! By continuing to listen, learn from and amplify the experiences and knowledge of diverse groups and people

Principle #5 about embracing pluralism. I think about the way that traditional ways of doing research in academia, institutions, schools, tend to be very exclusive by nature. We need to interrogate these in order to be authentic in that embrace.

embrace pluralism: rethink what type of knowledge is valued and encourage collaborative efforts

Embracing Pluralism - agree that complete knowledge comes from synthesizing multiple perspectives. What my work has taught me is the difference between data science and data know-how, we overlook that without data know
